2026 assessment notices mailed to property owners



Property owners in the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo (RMWB) should watch their mailboxes for the **2026 property assessment notices** which were **mailed on Feb. 11**.

Your assessment notice shows the assessed value of your property. This value is used to calculate your property taxes for 2026.

What to know right now

- Assessment notices are arriving in February.
- The deadline to file an assessment appeal is **April 20, 2026**.
- Property Tax Notices will be **mailed in May**.

How your property is valued

For the 2026 tax year, assessments are based on:

- Market value as of July 1, 2025.
- Property condition as of Dec. 31, 2025.

Questions or appeals

If you have concerns about your assessment, contact [Pulse](#) to speak with an assessor. If a resolution cannot be reached, you may file a formal appeal with the Assessment Review Board. The **appeal deadline** is April 20, 2026.

COMMUNITY NOTICE

How rural winter maintenance works in your community

Winter maintenance in rural communities is done by municipal contractors, and includes:

- Snow plowing and snow removal.
- Sanding/salting asphalt roadways whenever needed to create a safe driving surface.

Snow plowing in your community:

- Primary (high-traffic) roads are plowed within 24 hours of snowfall.
- School routes will be plowed within 24 hours for easier school pick-up and drop-off.
- Secondary roads are plowed within 48 hours.
- Gravel roads are plowed within 72 hours.
- Contractors will try to remove windrows (snowbanks) at residential and commercial driveways where possible.

Snow removal in your community:

- Contractors start snow removal when snowbanks are too high and block safe sightlines at intersections.

Help your community with winter maintenance:

- Remove garbage and recycling bins from the roadside to leave room for plowing.
- Do not shovel/push snow onto the road or into ditches, as this creates flooding issues in the spring.

Nominations opening for the 2026 Indigenous Sports Gallery on April 7

Celebrate youth athletes, community builders and local legends by submitting a nomination

The Municipality is looking for nominations of local First Nation and Métis athletes, community builders and local legends to be part of the 2026 Indigenous Sports Gallery as it travels around the region for public display.

The gallery is intended to inspire youth and celebrate the story of Indigenous athletes and their ongoing contributions to sport in the region. Nominations are open from April 7 to May 4.

The Wood Buffalo 2023 Arctic Winter Games created a travelling indigenous sports gallery to honour the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's [Call to Action 87](#).

The RMWB carried this legacy forward in 2024 with its own Indigenous Sports Gallery and will be hosting a new 2026 gallery exhibition this summer.

Selected nominees will be celebrated at an induction ceremony, with the gallery later travelling around the region for public display. The ceremony location will be announced at a later date.

Nomination qualifications

Must be a member of a local First Nation or Métis community and have lived within the RMWB for at least 12 consecutive months as of April 1, 2025.

Youth Athlete nomination

- Between 8 – 18 years old, as of April 1, 2025.
- Makes a positive contribution to their community and is devoted to sport.
- Demonstrates active participation and has admirable skills in their chosen sport.
- Participates in sport within their community, in regional, provincial or national competitions, on competitive post-secondary teams or elite stream competitions.
- Willing to contribute a quote about how sport has supported their well-being.

Community Builder nomination

- Makes a positive contribution as a leader of sport within their community.
- Demonstrates commitment and support for sport and well-being in their community.
- Demonstrates admirable values and/or personal characteristics.

Local Legend nomination

- An individual who has passed on to the spirit world and left a lasting impact within their community and contributed to the development of sport.

How to nominate

Fill out the form online at rmwb.ca/sportsgallery when nominations open on April 7. The nomination deadline is May 4.

Nominators should be prepared to describe their nominee's sporting achievements and community contributions in detail. Nominees will be selected for recognition in the gallery by a sharing circle of local community members.

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

Basketball Palooza brings students together at Conklin Multiplex

Snow fell steadily across the region on the morning of Basketball Palooza, but inside the Conklin Multiplex the energy was building. Students and staff from Anzac School, Bill Woodward School, Father R. Perin School and Conklin Community School arrived safely, ready for a full day of activity and teamwork.

Basketball Palooza opened with welcoming remarks from Conklin Community School Principal Bernard Woodfine, recognizing the host community. Elder Margaret Quintal shared an opening prayer, followed by O Canada led by Father R. Perin School teacher Laura Keith. Greetings were also shared by Ward 9 Trustee Jules Nokohoo, Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo Ward 4 Councillor Kyle Vandecasteyen and Superintendent of Schools and CEO Cal Johnson, who was joined by Associate Superintendent of Human Resources Krista Veitch as part of Northland's Executive Team.

After the opening ceremony, students moved into activities throughout the Multiplex. Students in Kindergarten to Grade 5 rotated through basketball related activity stations set up in different rooms. Activities included the Pirate Game, a Playground Challenge, and the Garbage Can Relay. Students also designed their own player jerseys, enjoyed a healthy snack, and took part in movement challenges that built coordination and confidence. Students in Grades 6 to 12 competed in basketball games in the main gymnasium throughout the day.

Basketball Palooza was created in response to feedback shared during community engagements for Northland School Division's Education Plan. Families, staff and students asked for more team sports and more chances for Northland students to come together. Basketball Palooza is one way Northland is acting on that feedback by creating opportunities for students to be active, play as a team, and build friendships between schools.
